Royal Navy representing the Britannia Royal Naval College, Dartmouth	Commodore Richard Ibbotson DSC Royal Navy	The Prince of Wales joined the Royal Naval College at Dartmouth in 1971 and embarked on a Naval career until leaving in December 1976. His Royal Highness commanded the mine hunter HMS Bronington for the last 10 months of his active service. The Prince of Wales currently holds the Royal Naval rank of Vice Admiral. Following the Gulf conflict Commodore Ibbotson was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross in 1991. Prior to taking command at Dartmouth, he was at sea in a multinational group of ships and submarines in anti-terrorist operations. Commodore Ibbotson took command at Dartmouth on 10 May 2004.
1st The Queen's Dragoon Guards	Colonel Christopher MacKenzie-Beevor CBE	The Prince of Wales took over as Colonel-in-Chief from Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother in 2003. 1st The Queen's Dragoon Guards is an armoured reconnaissance regiment which is currently deployed in Iraq.
The Royal Dragoon Guards	Brigadier Clendon Daukes	The Prince of Wales has been Colonel-in-Chief since 1992. The Royal Dragoon Guards formed in 1992 as a result of the amalgamation of the 4th/7th Royal Dragoon Guards and the 5th Inniskilling Dragoon Guards. The Royal Dragoon Guards is currently deployed on Operation TELIC in Iraq and are based in Munster, Northern Germany.
The Welsh Guards	Colonel Sandy Malcolm	The Prince of Wales has been Colonel of The Welsh Guards since 1975. The 1st Battalion The Welsh Guards is currently deployed in Iraq and will return to their base at RAF St Athan in South Wales next month.
The King's Regiment	Colonel Malcolm Grant Haworth CBE	The Prince of Wales took over as Colonel-in-Chief in 2003 from his Grandmother. The Regiment was formed in 1685 and now comprises of the 1st Battalion stationed with its families in Bourlon Barracks, Catterick Garrison, since March 2001 and the Territorial Army companies of the King's and Cheshire Regiment in the North West. The 1st Battalion were deployed on Operation TELIC 2 to Iraq.
The 22nd (Cheshire) Regiment	Major General Keith Skempton CBE	The Prince of Wales has been Colonel-in-Chief since 1977. Officers and men from the 1st Battalion The Cheshire Regiment returned from Iraq in October 2004 after a 6 month tour in Basra.
The Royal Regiment of Wales	Brigadier Robert Aitken	The Prince of Wales has been Colonel-in-Chief since 1969. The Royal Regiment of Wales was formed in June 1969 from the South Wales Borderers (24th Foot) and The Welch Regiment (41st/69th Foot) at an Amalgamation Parade in Cardiff Castle where new Colours were presented to the Regiment by its newly appointed Colonel-in-Chief, The Prince of Wales. The Regiment will shortly deploy to Iraq on Operation TELIC 6 from where the last returned in May 2004.

The Black Watch	General Sir Alistair Irwin KCB CBE	The Prince of Wales took over as Colonel-in-Chief of the Black Watch from Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother in 2003. The 1st Battalion The Black Watch have recently returned from operations in Iraq earning special mention for the role that they played operating from Camp Dogwood south of Baghdad.
The Highlanders	Brigadier The Honorable Hughie Monro CBE	The Prince of Wales has been Deputy Colonel-in-Chief since 1994. The Colonel-in-Chief is HRH The Duke of Edinburgh. The Highlanders are based in Fallingbommel in Germany. The Regiment was formed in 1994 when The Queen's Own Highlanders and The Gordon Highlanders, 2 of Scottish most legendary Regiments, merged to form The Highlanders (Seaforth, Gordons and Camerons).
The Parachute Regiment	General Sir John Reith KCB CBE	The Prince of Wales has been Colonel-in-Chief since 1977. The Parachute Regiment was formed in 1942. The Regimental motto is UTRINQUE PARATUS which means "ready for anything". The Prince of Wales attended the 60th anniversary of Arnhem in September 2004. Elements of The Parachute Regiment continue to serve around the world and have recently conducted tours in Southern Iraq. General Reith is Colonel Commandant of The Parachute Regiment and is currently the Deputy Supreme Allied Commander in Europe.
Royal Gurkha Rifles	Colonel David Hayes MBE	The Prince of Wales has been Colonel-in-Chief of the Royal Gurkha Rifles since 1977. Representing the Brigade of Gurkhas today is Colonel David Hayes who is Colonel of the Brigade of Gurkhas. The 1st Battalion is based in Folkestone and the 2nd Battalion is based in Brunei.
The Army Air Corps	General Sir Richard Dannatt KCB CBE MC	The Prince of Wales has been Colonel-in-Chief of the Army Air Corps since 1992. General Sir Richard Dannatt is Colonel Commandant of the Army Air Corps and is currently Commander in Chief Land Command. The Army Air Corps continue to operate helicopters in Iraq as part of Operation TELIC.
The Queen's Own Yeomanry	Colonel John Dalrymple- Hamilton OBE TD DL	The Prince of Wales has been Royal Honorary Colonel since 2000. They are a Territorial Army Regiment with squadrons based throughout the UK.
Royal Air Force Valley	Group Captain Mark Green	The Prince of Wales has been Honorary Air Commodore since 1993. Royal Air Force Valley, in Anglesey, North Wales, trains all RAF fast jet and search and rescue helicopter pilots. The Prince of Wales is a qualified RAF pilot and RAF Valley currently operates Hawk fast jet aircraft.

Royal Canadian Dragoons	Major General (Retd) Clive Addy, OMM, CD	The Prince of Wales has been Colonel-in-Chief since 1985. The Royal Canadian Dragoons are based at Petawawa, Ontario, and Major General Addy commanded the Regiment in the early 1980s.
Lord Strathcona's Horse (Royal Canadians)	Colonel Mark Egener CD	The Prince of Wales has been Colonel-in-Chief since 1977. The Regiment is based in Edmonton, Alberta and the personnel have served in Bosnia in late 2003 and deployed to Afghanistan in August 2004.
The Royal Regiment of Canada	Lieutenant Colonel Vijay Sharma	The Prince of Wales has been Colonel-in-Chief since 1977. The Royal Regiment of Canada was formed in 1939 (formerly The Toronto Regiment, formerly The 10th Royal Grenadiers) and is located at historic Fort York Armoury in Toronto, Ontario. It has represented Canada in peacekeeping missions around the world and in relief effort within Canada.
The Royal Winnipeg Rifles	Colonel Ray McFeetors	The Prince of Wales has been Colonel-in-Chief since 1977. Colonel McFeetors has flown in from Manitoba and is the Honorary Colonel.
The Toronto Scottish	Colonel Frederic Jackman	The Prince of Wales was appointed Colonel-in-Chief this year and the Regiment is based in Ontario, Canada. The Toronto Scottish Regiment is a army reserve unit based at Ford York Armoury. Colonel Jackman is the Honorary Colonel of the Regiment. Members of the Regiment have served with United Nations Peace Keeping Forces and with Canadian Forces Humanitarian Assistance Missions. Members of the Regiment are undergoing training in preparation for deployment in Afghanistan and Bosnia.
The Air Reserve of Canada	Brigadier General Robert Clark	The Prince of Wales has been Colonel-in-Chief since 1977. The primary role of the Air Reserve is to augment and support deployed forces and are primarily based in Ottawa and Winnipeg.
Royal Australian Armoured Corps	Lieutenant General Laurie O'Donnell, AC (Retd)	The Prince of Wales has been Colonel-in-Chief since 1977. On his recent overseas visit to Australia, The Prince of Wales met members of the Royal Australian Armoured Corps during the visit to the Australian War Memorial in Canberra.
The Royal Pacific Islands Regiment	Commodore Peter Ilau CBE	The Prince of Wales has been Colonel-in-Chief since 1984. The Royal Pacific Islands Regiment is from Papua New Guinea and today's representative is Commodore Peter Ilau who is the Commander of the Papua New Guinea Defence Force.
Equerry	Squadron Leader Richard Pattle RAF	Squadron Leader Pattle has been The Prince of Wales's Equerry for 1 year and is a RAF helicopter pilot who has served on operations in Northern Ireland, Kosovo and Iraq.
Welsh Guards Equerry	Captain Austen Salusbury WG	Captain Salusbury is a Welsh Guards officer who has served on operations in Bosnia, Northern Ireland and Iraq.
